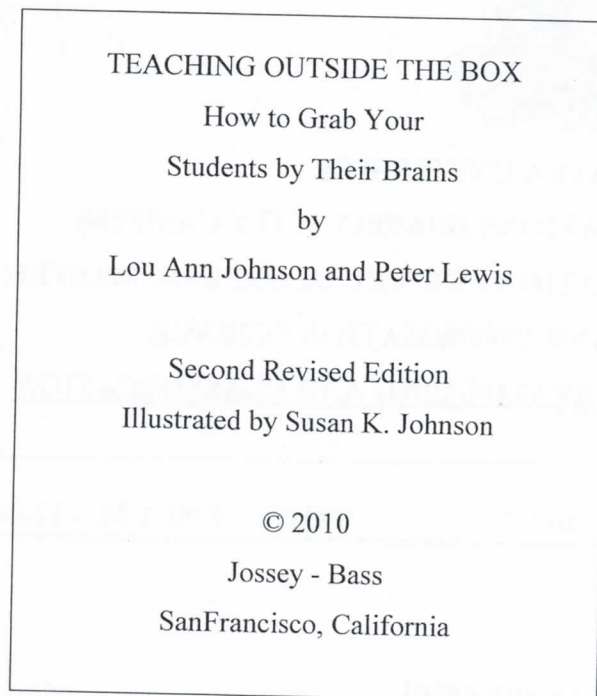
1. a) Explain broken order of arrangement and how it occurs in a library, possible problems of this order and suggest possible solutions to the problems

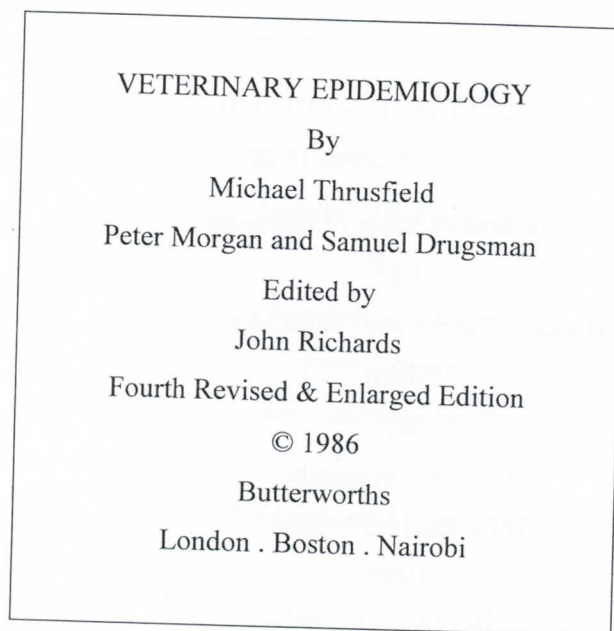
Other Details

This book is 17.2 cm wide and 23.7 cm high and it is profusely illustrated. It has bibliographies at chapter ends, and its ISBN is 978-0-7879-74718. Its preliminary pages are marked in roman numerals up to twelve while text pages are numbered 1-322. It is title number 22 in Teaching Study Series.

This outstanding title offers no-nonsense advice on how to bring out the best in both teachers and students. It covers: a step-by-step plan to make the first week of school a success; approaches for creating a positive discipline; methods for motivating students, especially reluctant readers; strategies for successful classroom management; and suggestions for creating and grading student portfolios.

Other Details

The ISBN of this title is 0-408-10861-4 and it has many illustrations, some of which are in colour. It has 12 preliminary pages marked in roman numerals and 280 pages marked in arabic figures. It has bibliographies covering pages 272 to 276 and it measures 24.2 cm in height and 18.4 cm in width.

This book is designed as an introduction to veterinary epidemiology for the veterinary undergraduate, for the graduate student who later wishes to study more advanced texts, and for those from other disciplines who have an interest in veterinary epidemiology. It is also hoped that the book will be of value to any veterinarian concerned with farm or companion animals whether working in a developed or a developing country.

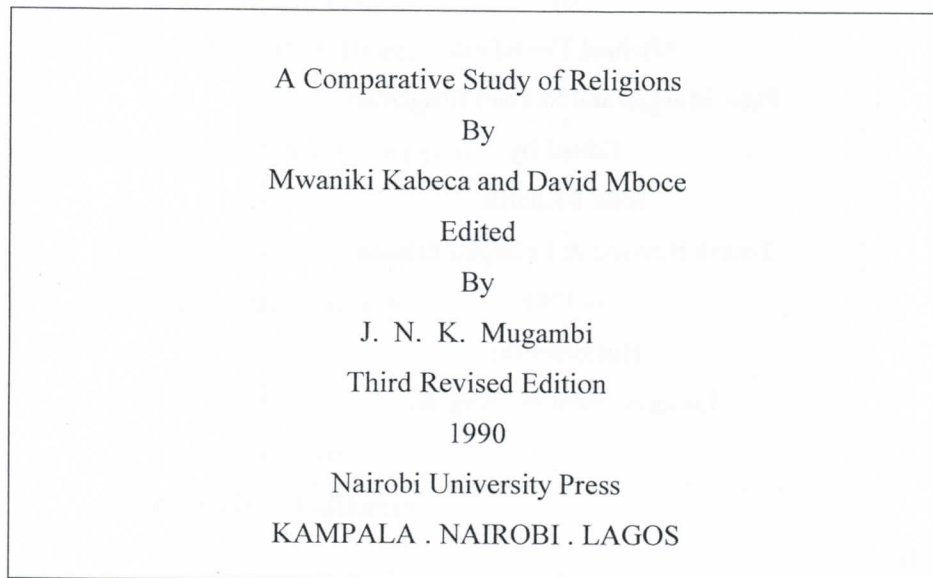

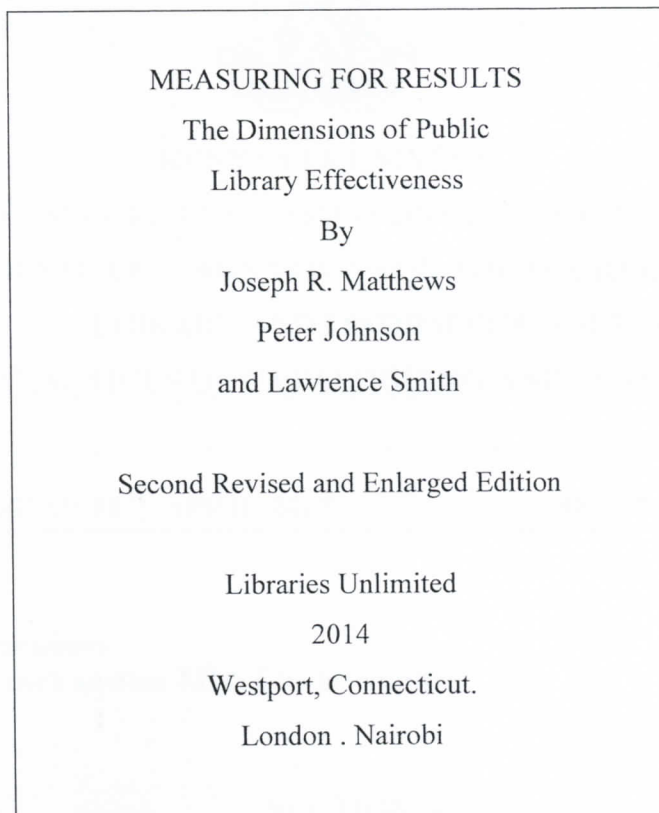


Other Details

The ISBN of this title is 9966846038 and it measures 21.2 cm in width and 14.4 cm in height. It has eight preliminary pages marked in roman numerals followed by a numbering of text pages in arabic numerals from 9-311. It has a bibliography from page 299 to 302 and it is variously illustrated.

This book is the result of concerted teamwork and it covers the whole range of major religions of the world with extensive geographical and historical scope. It includes a specific section of African Religions, thus placing the African Religious Heritage within the mainstream of the comparative study of the world's religions. (20 marks)

Other Details

This title measures 20.3 cm wide and 25.6 cm high and its ISBN is 1-59158-1002. Its preliminary pages are numbered from i-xvi while text pages are numbered 17-397. It has bibliographies at chapter ends and it is title number 17 in "Public Libraries Development Series"

Historically, public librarians have relied on the perceived "value or goodness" of the public library as a means to garner financial support. However, it is now becoming apparent that public librarians must demonstrate, using an acceptable methodology, the economic value of the library and its services. This title is a compendium of valuable information about the research and literature surrounding this issue.
